

Who is eligible for the Juan Ramon Scholarship?

- Applicants must attend or plan on attending an accredited two- or four-year college or university to pursue an undergraduate or graduate degree within the field of finance or in a finance-related field. Technical colleges included.
- Applicants must be or plan to be enrolled full-time in college courses, defined as being enrolled in at least twelve (12) credit hours.
- Applicants must demonstrate academic success, as demonstrated by a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 unweighted GPA on a 4.0 scale.
- Applicants must show evidence of impact in their community, which is determined by their capacity to convey in writing their leadership abilities and their support for and contribution to the LGBTQ community.

Applicants will be asked to submit the following required documentation during the process:

- Official transcript showing GPA as well as ACT and/or SAT scores
- Recommendation letter from a faculty/staff member at your school or a professional supervisor
- A personal statement that describes their contribution to the LGBTQ Community.
- Documentation of financial need may be required.

How does an applicant apply for the Juan Ramon Guerrero Scholarship?

To access the application, follow these steps:

- Go to [MyScholarship](#)
- Click “Create New Account” and follow the instructions
- Once logged into [MyScholarship](#), type “JRG” in the box labeled “Access Code” to the right
- Click “Enter Code”
- Review the information on the Application Page
- Click “Apply”
- Complete all required fields and click on “Submit Application” when complete.

What are the funding specifications and selection process for the Juan Ramon Guerrero Scholarship?

- 1 scholarship will be awarded annually over 9 years.
- Each scholarship will award up to \$10,000 for educational expenses with a maximum cap of \$5,000 a year.
- The JRG Scholarship Committee (Committee) will review applications using an online evaluation tool.
- The Committee may ask finalists to complete an interview.
- After the evaluation, the Committee will make scholarship recipient recommendations to the Central Florida Foundation Board of Directors for final approval.

Criteria were developed based on input from an anonymous donor, reflecting our collective efforts and commitment. The scholarship committee will reflect the community affected by the Pulse Tragedy.

The Committee will be staffed by a member of the Central Florida Foundation professional team.
